

Research: Race and Ethnicity Stratification Learning Network

- The Race and Ethnicity Stratification learning Network provided a first look at trends in health plan performance variation by race and ethnicity.
- Evaluated the state of race and ethnicity data and feasibility of reporting on the stratification.
- Shares best practices and strategies plans have employed to integrate the stratification and how it has informed quality improvement initiatives.

3-Year Status



Designed as a foundation for work to continuously improve and prioritize health equity.



Focused on collecting demographic data (e.g., race, ethnicity) to understand members' or patients' needs, then identify and act on opportunities to reduce disparities and improve the cultural and linguistic appropriateness of care.



3-Year Status



Builds on NCQA's Health Equity Accreditation (its prerequisite).



Designed for **organizations progressing to the next step** of their health equity journey.



Focused on: collecting data and partnering with community-based organizations and cross-sector partners to address social needs of individuals served and mitigate social risks of the community.





NCQA's Health Equity Accreditation Plus

Collection, Acquisition and Analysis of Community and Individual Data

Collect data to identify—and prioritize—subsets of membership with intersecting social needs and upstream social risks

Cross-Sector Partnerships and Engagement

Collaborate with and meaningfully engage cross-sector partners to provide social needs resources and work to mitigate communities' longstanding social risks and structural barriers

Data Management and Interoperability

Establish structures that protect social needs data, facilitate interoperability between partners, and create a seamless experience for members

Program to Improve Social Risks and Address Social Need

Create structures and measurable goals with meaningful involvement from the community and membership to identify necessary improvements or changes (priorities, partners, goals)

Referrals, Outcomes and Impact

Work with partners to track referrals for social needs resources, identify disparities in referrals, and identify necessary improvements to the partnerships
